3. Guest Speaker, Leah Levinger, Chicago Housing Initiative

- What is Affordable Housing? Affordable for median income for the 6 country region area. Medium income family of 4 \$74,800. Low Income = 50-80% of AMI \$37,405 \$59,850
- Subsidized Housing up to \$60k majority is \$22K range. Tenants pay 30% of income for rent sliding scale.
- Must work 20 hours or in school full time and special exemption (disabled, elderly)
- Deny felonies, sex offender, drug offences (dealing/manufacturing)
- Limits on number of people 2 people per bedroom (adults and children).
- Section 8 least oversight voucher program.
- This neighborhood set aside section
- Landlords responsible for screening and can reject credit, housekeeping
- New program project based voucher (market based rents, shared risk)
- Oversight and monitoring Governed by tenant/landlord law
- Affordable Requirements Ordinance (ARO) requires 20% affordable for the median income of area. Mandatory in new developments near transit. 10% of units must be affordable.

- Project Based Voucher can be layered upon ARO program. It is dependent on the owner. Not in developer forefront. Not marketed.
- Section 8 tenant and landlord unknown to each other (voucher program)
- Project Based Voucher prescreens landlords to lesson discrimination (geared towards larger buildings)
