- 2. Special Guests
 - a. Commander William Looney, 16th District, Chicago Police Department

Commander Looney, a resident of Portage Park, spoke to us about crime in the District. Year-to-date property crimes, robberies and motor vehicles theft are up. CPD has made 70 arrests for property crime this year; 28 burglary arrests this year. National Night Out is coming at Norwood Park later this year. Beat meetings are held every other month and are listed on the JPF calendar.

Police are assigned to a district based on service calls. The 16th District is still short on police officers in the area, however, the district recently received 6 new officers. There are around 200 officers assigned to the 16th district, which is geographically the largest district in the City, stretching from Cicero on the east and Belmont on the south to the city borders.

Q/A session hit on a number of issues including the sexual assault that took place near Farnsworth School in the spring, traffic issues on Laramie Ave south of Lawrence and the blue light program, which is a way of supporting Police by displaying a blue light on your home.

b. Representative Robert Martwick, District 19, Illinois General Assembly

Rep. Martwick addressed the group by discussing the stopgap budget that was passed last month as well as explaining budgetary math, pension funding, social services and education. There was an open Q/A session.

- 3. JPF Committee Updates
 - a. Bylaws

Bylaws have been posted on the JPF website since June for public comment until Friday, July 22. The Bylaws Committee has received a handful of comments that it will incorporate into the final draft. The Board of Directors is expected to approve and adopt the Bylaws as the official governance document of Jefferson Park Forward at its August 4 meeting. Upon adoption of the bylaws, the leadership team of Jefferson Park Forward will be formally established. The JPF officers and board of directors is:

Each board member will serve a two year term, with half of the board up for elections every year. For the inaugural board, half of the board will serve a shortened one year term. General elections will be held in September 2017.

Upon adoption, JPF will also formalize the membership boundaries, which are Montrose to the south, Austin to the west, the Chicago River to the north and Cicero Avenue/Elston Avenue/Metra Milwaukee District North Line on the east.

JPF is in the process of establishing annual dues to support the organization's programs in fulfillment of its mission and vision. The treasurer will be presenting a budget, dues and membership information at the August or September general meeting.
